## Course Description

This program addresses planning and preparing for students during their clinical education experiences, developing learning experiences, and supporting ongoing learning through questioning and effective feedback. Skills of student evaluation are discussed, as well as the identification and management of students with exceptional situations. The program also introduces information regarding legal implications for clinical educators, including issues presented by ADA legislation.

The Assessment Center provides the physical therapist and physical therapist assistant participants the opportunity to apply information from the program in simulated situations. Successful completion of each station in the Assessment Center will result in the awarding of the APTA C/Credential.

## Audience

The program is designed for both new and experienced clinical educators. APTA will award a credential to physical therapists and physical therapist assistants who attend all sessions and successfully complete the Assessment Center. APTA will provide a certificate of completion to members of professions other than physical therapy.

All participants will be required to sign a Participant Agreement on Day 1 of the course. Those participating in the Assessment Center will sign a Statement of Confidentiality. There may be certain activities taught that by law cannot be performed by the physical therapist assistant or other healthcare professionals.

## Objectives

By the end of the program, the participant Clinical Instructor will be able to:

- Identify his/her role and responsibilities as a CI
- Examine a student's readiness to learn

- Integrate learning experiences in the clinical environment
- Assess a student's performance
- Reflect congruency with documentation of student performance and measurement in the CPI.
- Develop skills for the management of exceptional students
- Discuss some of the legal issues in clinical education
